What is ACSI?

As the largest association of Protestant schools in the world, Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI) provides a full range of education services worldwide through a headquarters office and 26 regional offices:

- 10 U.S. regional offices
- 2 Canadian regional offices
- 14 international offices

ACSI serves more than 5,900 member Christian schools in more than 106 nations, enrolling about 1,450,000 students and comprising the following rounded numbers of students:*

- 545,700 students in U.S. K-12 member schools
- 25,100 students in Canadian K-12 member schools
- 546,400 students in international K-12 member schools
- 146,800 students in early education member programs worldwide
- 186,000 students in member colleges and universities worldwide

ACSI serves 139 member Christian colleges and universities.

ACSI is a 501(c)(3) religious nonprofit organization.

What is ACSI's history?

In 1978 several regional Christian school associations joined, recognizing that they could make a greater impact together than they could individually. They founded the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI) to provide resources for schools around the world. First headquartered in La Habra, California, ACSI moved to an expanded facility in Colorado Springs, Colorado, in 1994. Today, in addition to the headquarters facility, ACSI has 26 regional offices in North America and around the globe. The association is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit religious education association governed by a 36-member executive board that is elected by and representative of member schools.
